HOLIDAY MARKET

Please plan to join us on Saturday, Nov. 5th from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM for our ninth annual Holiday Market. There will be shopping-- 47 booths of vendors with lots of great merchandise and hand made items for you, your family, and/or Christmas presents. There will be a silent auction with many awesome items to bid on, a bake sale, and live entertainment. It's going to be a fun day! Tell your friends and neighbors to join us! Thanks to the Holiday Market Committee for organizing this event and all the time and effort they are putting into it! Thank you also to everyone who is helping us with donations and your time on the 5th. This is our biggest fund raising event for the year and all of the proceeds from this event will be used to buy items for your children to use in the classrooms.

THANKSGIVING FEASTS

One of our biggest events of the year is the Thanksgiving Feast. The children in the three through five year old classes will participate in this event. Each day we will do a program at **11:30** in the sanctuary and then move to the Family Life Center for our feast. I suggest that you arrive a little early so that you won't miss your child's part in the program. The feast is usually over about 12:30 or whenever you are finished eating. There is no Tumblebus on these days. Children do not need a lunch that day because we have food for everyone. Thursday, Nov. 17th is for Mrs. Deiters, Mrs. Morrison, Mrs. Kehoe and Mrs. Davalos' classes. Friday, Nov. 18th is for Mrs. Moskal, Mrs. Dreyer, Mrs. Micale, and Mrs. Armentrout's classes.



We are asking each family to contribute \$2 per preschool child and \$3 per adult towards the food for our feast and would welcome any other monetary donations. We also need help each morning preparing the food. There will be child care available for siblings during food preparation as well as the program and feast. A note will be sent home Nov. 1st & 2nd. Please return it as soon as possible to let us know how many people will be attending (limit of 2 adults per child for the feast), how many siblings will need child care, if you can help with food preparations, and if you can donate something extra towards the feast. There is no limit to the number of people who can watch the program, but only two adults for the feast. We hope that everyone can come!

We will also be making a DVD of the programs and some highlights in the Family Life Center. They will be on sale for \$5 each. You'll be receiving an order form soon. Hopefully this will help you enjoy the program rather than concentrating on filming it.

REQUESTS AND REMINDERS

phonics, we finished learning the last two

with three clues for the item he/she brings. The

his/her first name well, begin to practice their
last name, as well. I also want to remind parents
to encourage your child to memorize his/her
birthday, phone number, and address. This
information takes time to memorize, but they are
essential to learn before kindergarten.
Congratulations! Several students have come
into class since Open House and have correctly
recited all three of these to me and were
awarded their ribbons!

Each Thursday, a different child gets to

We all have enjoyed the entertaining tales of
Buzzy's adventures with the children and their
