Dear Dr. Terrell,

Please consider this the formal request of the Administrative Board of Due West United Methodist Church for a timely called church conference for the sole purpose of voting to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church under the provisions of Paragraph 2553 of the 2016 Book of Discipline as amended by General Conference 2019. We previously notified you of this vote by letter dated October 29, 2022.

The vote of our Administrative Board to make this request was 18 Yes votes and 5 No votes taken at the October 24, 2022, meeting. (Official Minutes attached). It is our intention to continue communication with our congregation including town hall meetings to inform our church of this decision and the options before us.

We are aware of the statement issued on December 28, 2022, from then Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson, the Appointive Cabinet, and the Conference Board of Trustees relating to the purported "pause" of the disaffiliation process in North Georgia. Respectfully, we believe this action to be a direct violation of the Book of Discipline, contrary to the language of Paragraph 2553, and beyond the authority of the bishop, cabinet, and trustees.

It should be noted that Due West United Methodist Church has done nothing to violate the Book of Discipline and is in good standing as defined by the Conference Board of Trustees at the 2022 Annual Conference Session. Additionally, this church has done nothing to engage in any negative conduct as outlined in the December 28, 2022, statement. Moreover, you, Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson and Randy Hardy the Central West District Lay Leader spoke to our congregation presenting the conference positions and perspectives on disaffiliation. They had the unfettered and unlimited ability to communicate any corrective information desired and in fact did so.



Therefore, it is inequitable and unjust to prohibit Due West United Methodist Church from continuing through the revised agreement and disaffiliation process found on page 77 of the 2022 Annual Conference Handbook, as presented to and accepted by the 2022 Annual Conference Session Two on June 3, 2022 (Conference Journal page 268) after 70 local church disaffiliations were approved by the conference during Session One on June 2, 2022, as documented on page 266 of the 2022 Conference Journal.

Therefore, we prayerfully expect you to set the date for the church conference as requested and provided for by the 2019 General Conference actions in Paragraph 2553. We expect to receive a reply to this letter no later than ten (10) days from the date of this letter. We are not expecting you to set a date for a vote within ten days, but that you merely reply to this letter. If we do not receive a reply by that date, we will assume you do not intend to reply.



October Ad Board Devotional

2 Corinthians 4:7-10 (From the Immerse Bible)

We now have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. This makes it clear that our great power is from God, not from ourselves. We are pressed on every side by troubles, but we are not crushed. We are perplexed, but not driven to despair. We are hunted down, but never abandoned by God. We get knocked down, but we are not destroyed. Through suffering, our bodies continue to share in the death of Jesus so that the life of Jesus may also be seen in our bodies.

For the past 39 months I have trouble on all sides;

- The sudden sickness and death of my wife
- The flooding of our house two weeks after her death, resulting in only half the house to live in for the next 6 weeks
- Before we can get the house put back together my daughter is in the hospital diagnosed with the life changing illness of Type 1 Diabetes
- In January 2020 I first hear the word Protocol and I realize I have another trouble to deal with as the Ad Board Chair of my church
- Just as life is somewhat normal in March, we are locked down by COVID
- I also have unfinished business at home. My wife and I had planned to develop the post-secondary education plan for our 18-year-old developmentally delayed son during the 2019-2020 school year. Not only did I not have my schoolteacher wife to help, but the resources at the State were also severely impacted by COVID
- Then in April of 2020 I lose my sister after a short cancer illness also,

I need these verses above! The words distressed, perplexed, and despair I have experienced. It would not be truthful if I had said I had not experienced these feelings during the last 39 months

But I have not felt **forsaken.** I have not felt cast down and I have not felt destroyed! My faith in what Jesus did for us on the Cross has provided peace. Participation in choir, small group bible study and worship even in the new environment of Zoom did provide the comfort of the Body of Christ. And made it even more special when we could engage person to person again.

I'm thankful my parents brought me to church and Sunday school every week. I am thankful for the ministers, Sunday school teachers, choir, and youth directors of my youth. I am thankful for God's Holy Spirit who convinced me of my sinful nature as a college freshman and led me to the understanding that I needed to rely on his strength and not mine to be the holy person that I desired to be and the person God is calling me to be.

I am thankful for the more years than I wanted, living as a single person waiting for God to bring my wife Trish in my life and provide the family I longed for. But in those years, I was able to build my knowledge and understanding of God's Word without other responsibilities getting in my way.

Only the foundations of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ have provided strength for me to live in this fragile clay jar over the last 39 months.
